The aims of the training course were to improve physical skills and to develop professional knowledge on many fields. This course was to give the participants the right definition regarding the organisation, planning, coordinating and development of the escort missions.

The course was very complex and has included the following fields:

- First aid
- Firearms basics and safe use / theoretical & practical part
- Bomb investigation / theoretical & practical part
- Rescuing from the water and diving basics / theoretical & practical part
- Three days antiterrorist training in Special Police Forces' Center (Climbing up & down the buildings, house searching, hindrance, different weapon shooting, etc.)
- Law and basics of criminology
- VIP tactics / theoretical & practical part
- Technique and technology of security
- Martial Arts / Real Aikido by Mr. Vracarevic
- VIP Protection with practical shooting

At the end the participants had a written exam (three hours) and practical exam with real VIP (three hours + one hour written report time). As the final closing of the training course, every student has received an IBSSA Certificate of Participation and a Diploma of Qualification, an IBSSA Passport and badge as well.
