Address of Dom Lorenzo for the Opening Ceremony of the 10th Congress of IBSSA

19th March 2005

As I recall the significant achievements and works of the 9th International IBSSA Congress, to which I was fortunate to participate, and as the Working Sessions of the 10th International IBSSA Congress begins, I wish I could have been among you.

However, higher duties prevented me from being with you today, because of my responsibilities as a religious Leader and Servant of the Church. But I assure you that as I officiate during the coming days the Services of the Holy Week, commemorating once more the Passion, Death and Resurrection of My Lord Jesus Christ in the Church Cathedral of the American Orthodox Catholic Church of Dallas, Texas, I will have each one of you in my mind and in my prayers.

This is an especial occasion for celebration; you are already congregating for the tenth year, to plan, coordinate and bettering the activities of the International Association of Bodyguard and Security Services. For all those of you that were here on the first International Congress, this date is marked with the sign of Victory. Look at all the work done, at all the refinement obtained through hard work and dedication! You can be proud and consider that the IBSSA of today has been made with your efforts, with your enthusiasm with your loyalty, with your work and with your hands.

I pleaded to you to uphold at all times your ethic principles, to respect the human rights of every individual, and to bear always in mind not to be discourteous, rude or abusive of your power. Should I ask you this year something less?

As I invoke upon you the protection and the inspiration of the Almighty Creator of all, I wish you a good and profitable work during the working sessions of this 10th International IBSSA Congress. God bless you all
